**RE:** *Graduating Class Privileges*

Again, thank you. Thank you for your requested graduation privileges for the Senior Class of 2010 “to celebrate and conclude your wonderful experience at CB”. I applaud your genuine professionalism and respectful, well-reasoned approach. This is a clear demonstration of your servant-leadership.

Please, allow me to share my final determinations. The following have been approved:

- You have approval for “Februhairy.” Men will be permitted to have facial hair during the month of February. Women will be permitted to put “unnatural” colors into their hair (pink, purple, etc.) during the month of February. All seniors are required to be clean shaven and hair color restored according to CB’s Dress Code by Monday, March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- You have approval for one Senior Class *Holiday* for **Monday, March 1<sup>st</sup>**. Your Class Moderators will need to inform the CB faculty/staff and senior parents as soon as possible as to the specific date of this excused absence. - You have approval for the advanced purchase of Upper Division Ball bids, with Seniors given two (2) days to pick their seats before the list is open to other eligible students.
- You have approval for a Modified “Grads Only” Attire starting March 16, 2010. Attached to this memo are the approved guidelines to be followed which can be effectively enforced without distracting from teaching/learning.
