

2017-2018 FRESHMAN CLASS COUNCIL APPLICATION PROCESS

QUALIFICATIONS

A person seeking election for a student council office must be willing to devote the necessary time and effort to that class office and to the student council. One must be willing to assume the responsibilities and duties of the office as outlined in the job description and this election material: maintain a grade point average of 2.5, live by the "Honor Code of Reverence, Respect, and Responsibility" as stated in the Parent/Student Handbook, the Student Body Constitution, and the Five Core Principles of a Lasallian School. Officers must be in good standing with the Student Activities Directors, and not be subject to any administrative contractual stipulations. Failure to maintain these standards will result in the elected officer being suspended or removed from office.

JOB DESCRIPTION FOR FRESHMAN CLASS OFFICERS

- Attend Leadership Camp July 28 30, 2017
- Attend Student Council Class every Tuesday during the school year
- Attend all student council meetings
- Help plan class family liturgy
- Be a student representative of the freshman class
- Oversee the organization of all class activities
- Serve as a liaison between the freshman class and ASB
- Support school-wide activities
- Meet regularly with other council members to conduct class business
- Attend all class meetings
- Organize meeting agendas
- Attend and help at all Student Council and class-sponsored events
- Maintain constant contact with Class Moderator(s) and Student Activities Directors
- Fulfill 30 minutes of work each week in the LSLO
- Maintain a 2.5 grade point average

FIVE CORE PRINCIPLES OF LASALLIAN EDUCATION

You are to know and live by The Five Core Principles of a Lasallian School:

- 1. Faith in the Presence of God: Student council helps with school liturgies, and plans their class family liturgy. You are not required to be Catholic to be on student council, but you are to have an open heart and open mind to the Catholic and Lasallian charism of our school.
- 2. Respect for all People: Your candidacy is required to be positive and respectful of yourself, our school, student activities, and your opponents for office. You are expected to be a role model for your peers on and off campus and live by the school guidelines. Dress code should NEVER be an issue, for example. School work will be completed; all activities will be supported.
- 3. Quality Education: You are required to maintain a 2.5 GPA to hold an office. The level of classes you take is not important. What is important is that you are to do your best in your classes.

- 4. We are for the poor and social justice: You are a servant leader. Your office allows you to serve all the students in your class specifically. You should run for office because of the passion within you to serve your school. You are a faithful servant first and a leader second.
- 5. Inclusive Community: Activities will be planned and evaluated to make sure ALL students and other community members in our school are invited and encouraged to participate. Student council will be expected to be the highest priority of all your extra-curricular activities.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The application process for a Freshman Class Council Member must include completion of each of the following items:

- Online completion of the Freshman Class Council Application
- Teacher/Administrator letter of recommendation

After review of applications and a grade verification, applicants will be contacted regarding their status to interview with the CBHS ASB Council. These interviews will take place beginning at 3:30 p.m. on May 22 through May 24. You will be notified of the time and place of the interview upon approval of your application.

TIMELINE FOR SELECTION PROCESS

Friday, April 28: All freshman class council candidate applications and recommendations are due at CBHS no later than 4 pm. Recommendations may be turned in via e-
