



“A Night on the Red Carpet” CBHS 2022 Homecoming Dance Essential Information

The **CBHS HOMECOMING DANCE** is **Saturday, September 24 from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m.** Doors close at 8:00 pm and reopen at 9:30 pm. All CB students are invited to attend. The dance will take place outside in the Koppes Plaza. **Entrance is between Field House and Cafeteria. Student Drop Off is in the south parking lot near the dance entrance. Pick up is in the same location OR on school property in front of the school.**

CBHS students may invite **ONE** guest who does not attend CB to the Homecoming Dance. If the guest is from St. Francis, Jesuit or Cristo Rey, a guest pass is not required. All other guests, require a Guest Pass Request form completed and submitted to the LSLO no later than Thursday, September 15. Tickets should not be purchased until the Guest Pass Request Form is approved by Mrs. Powers in the LSLO.

Dances at Christian Brothers High School are high-school-age-appropriate events. All students and guests must meet the following requirements:

- May not arrive or depart in rented vehicles, limousines, buses, or RVs to any dance
- Be currently enrolled in high school (9th – 12th grade).
- Freshmen may not attend dances with seniors.
- **Seniors only** are allowed to bring a guest from the previous year’s high school graduating class only. A Guest Pass Request form must be submitted. Guests may be no older than 19 years old, and valid photo identification must be included.
- Be a student in good standing, verified by the school administration.
- Have a current and valid student identification card from his/her high school.

HOMECOMING DANCE DRESS CODE

Christian Brothers High School has a Homecoming Dance Dress code to encourage students to make appropriate choices and represent themselves well. Any student, including guests from another school, not following the Homecoming Dance Dress Code **WILL NOT** be allowed to enter the dance. The basic principle for dress at CBHS is clothes must be worn in a way such that a person's genitals, buttocks, stomach, abdomen, breasts, and chests are fully covered with opaque fabric.

Semi-formal dresses are allowed and must meet the following regulations:

- Dresses should be modest and appropriate in style and fit for the CBHS setting
- Strapless and spaghetti strap modestly fitting dresses are allowed
- Dress/skirt length **may not be any shorter than mid-thigh**
- No dresses allowed with a bare midriff or bare lower back
- No dresses allowed revealing excessive cleavage
- No dresses allowed that are excessively tight and/or short

DANCE DRESS CODE continued:

Semi-formal suits are allowed and must meet the following regulations:

- dress pants or slacks
- dress shirt and tie
- sweaters or jackets, as needed

*******SHOE REGULATIONS*******

Because this dance will take place outside on the concrete, **hard soled dress shoes and spike heels are discouraged. Students are encouraged to wear flats or athletic shoes. Coat and shoe check will be available.**

HOMECOMING DANCE BEHAVIOR CODE

Students must follow the directives of the adult prefects and security personnel during a dance. The following rules will be in effect at all dances:

1. The school has a right to conduct random breathalyzer tests at dances, upon admittance and at any time during the dance. Detection Canines may be used to survey cars and bags for alcohol, drugs, etc. Further onsite testing for controlled substances may be called for as well as other forms of tests deemed necessary by the school.
2. Anyone found to be in possession of or under the influence of controlled substances will be turned over to the Deans of Students or the Student Activities Directors. That student will be removed from the dance immediately, required to be tested for controlled substances and/or take a breathalyzer test, and his/her parent will be called. Law enforcement may be notified.
3. Once a student has been admitted to a dance, students will not be allowed to go to their automobiles, lockers, or to the parking lots.
4. Students exhibiting the following may face appropriate consequences:
 - Inappropriate dancing, including straddling another person, lap dancing, grinding, freaking, or any other type of dance considered lewd or potentially dangerous
 - Removal of clothing violating the dance dress code.
 - Possession or use of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, electronic cigarettes/vaporizers or other contraband.
 - Any other behavior deemed unsafe or inappropriate by adult chaperones.
5. Appropriate behavior is determined by school staff. First warning may include confiscation of student body card and temporary removal from the dance floor. If unacceptable behavior continues, students may be removed from the dance and parents notified. Further disciplinary action (including not being allowed to attend future dances) may be warranted. CBHS staff makes the final decision regarding appropriate behavior.
